SZ Asia's fourth-best city of the future

SHENZHEN was ranked fourth in the 2011-2012 ranking of Asian and Pacific Cities of the Future.

Four Chinese cities including Shanghai, Shenzhen, Hong Kong and Beijing were in the top 20, according to the SV magazine, an English-language bi-monthly arts and foreign bank investment publication owned by the Financial Times Group and based in London.

Shanghai ranked second behind Singapore, which retained the title. Shanghai performed well in the category of business potential and human resource management.

Shenzhen ranked 22nd in the category of business potential and revealed the fourth in its city recognized by international investors.

Hong Kong ranked sixth, followed by Beijing, which ranked seventh.

The SV magazine focuses primarily on cities of foreign direct investment and in-depth analysis of corporate investment.

The number of foreign investment projects involving more than 1.5 billion dollars has greatly increased in Shenzhen this year.

Statistics from Shenzhen Association of Entrepreneurs With Foreign Investment showed the city attracted 21,700 foreign investment projects in the first six months of the year, an increase of 90.5 percent compared with the same period of last year.

The city also approved 1,500 foreign investment projects this year, an increase of 40 percent.
